Our Policies

"We want to ensure a beneficial dance experience for all of our students." Elizabeth Fisk Barisser, BCB Founder/Artistic Director

Non-profit Organization/Non-Discrimination Notice - Brass City Ballet (BCB) admits students of any race, sex, sexual orientation, gender, religion, national or ethnic origin, and does not discriminate on the basis of such in administering its policies and educational programs.

Class Attendance - We expect all our students to attend class on a regular basis. Students who do not attend class regularly may find that they have not kept pace with the program's requirements. As a result, they may be inadequately prepared for performance or promotion to the next level. If a student consistently misses class, he/she may be removed from a performance.

Let us know of any absences from class or rehearsal by emailing info@brasscityballet.org or calling (203) 598-0186. When we don't know why your child is absent, we get concerned.

Make-Up Lessons - If, for whatever, reason, your child misses a lesson, ask our Studio Manager for a list of suitable make-up classes. During production weeks prior to The Nutcracker and other major productions, there are limited classes available for the Concentrated Studies students. The youth and adult classes are still held, as scheduled, during those times.

Waiting Room - Respect must always be given to the class or rehearsal in progress. Please keep voices and sounds in the waiting areas to a minimum.

Policies (Cont'd)

Arrivals - Under age 11 - Students under the age of 11 may not be dropped at the door to walk upstairs alone. Students under the age of 11 must be supervised until class begins.

Late arrival - Please make sure your dancer arrives early, giving them plenty of time to dress and warm up before class begins. When a dancer enters a class late, they must ask the teacher permission to join class. If more than ten minutes late, they may be asked to sit out and observe class.

Pick-Up - The traffic within the parking lot is unpredictable. Therefore, we ask your child to wait inside the building. If your car is parked on the side of the building, your child will be permitted to leave and go to the car unattended. Do not ask your child to cross the parking lot unattended. If you are parked across the lot, please come to the door to escort your child. Please be on time to pick up your dancer. If you are running late, please call us at (203) 598-0186 and let us know. If you are continuously late, your family may be charged a \$50 per fifteen minutes fee and may be asked to leave the school.

Policies (Cont'd)

Communications - Between teachers & parents - When you need to speak with a teacher, please refrain from doing so right before or during class. Please contact us by emailing <u>info@brasscityballet.org</u> to set up a conference time.

Notices - Always check your emails for notices and updates since we do not always hand out flyers. At times, there are last minute rehearsal changes, canceled classes, costume issues, etc. Please do not contact the faculty on personal cell phones unless it is an emergency. We strongly encourage you to check out our website, <u>www.brasscityballet.org</u>, and like our Facebook page (Brass City Ballet), Instagram (@brasscityballet), and Twitter (BCBallet).

Social Media - Please be sensitive to your fellow dancers. No photographs or videos are allowed during class except during parent observation week. This includes the young children's classes. Be respectful of your teachers and peers in any texts, social media comments, or videos that appear online. Bullying, harassment, or defamatory statements will not be tolerated and are grounds for dismissal at BCB.



Class Cancellations - If there is a class cancellation, we will notify you via email. It will also be posted on our Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter accounts.

Injury - If your child is injured, they should still come to watch class and rehearsals. There is great value to observation. It prevents your dancer from falling behind in learning new concepts that are introduced or steps that are rearranged that day.

Withdrawals - If circumstances lead you to withdraw your child from BCB, we require 30 days written notice. Please be reminded that tuition is nonrefundable, as was stated and agreed to by signature when you registered for class on our Jackrabbit portal. If BCB policies are not respected, we reserve the right to dismiss the student from BCB. If you withdraw, please come say good-bye. Our teachers and staff form a close bond with your child and will miss them!

Refunds - BCB tuition and fees are non-refundable and will not be reimbursed for any reason other than illness or injury, in which case a doctor's note is required.

Policies (Cont'd)

Attire outside of the studio - The dance attire is very special and belongs solely in the studio. Leotards, tights, socks and ballet slippers are designed to ease the freedom of movement while also allowing the teacher and student to see the lines and positioning of the body. Dancers, no matter the age, do not wear their studio dance attire out into the streets. We ask that when you leave the building, you wear a top with a skirt, pants or shorts.

Dance Journals - All Ballet 2/3 and Concentrated Studies students are required to have a dance journal. These are needed for writing dance notes, exercises, corrections, thoughts or drawings. They also become a wonderful memento of your child's dancing career at BCB!

Dance Bag Contents - Depending on the age of the dancer and the level she/he is in, we recommend stocking the dancer's bag with the following: dance journal, extra pair of tights & leotard, ballet slippers, pointe shoes, sewing kit (needle &, dental floss), lamb's wool or paper towels for pointe shoes, ballet skirt, hair gel, hair spray, extra bobby pins, hair elastics, hairnets, brush, dance sweaters, leggings or leg warmers, hygiene products, deodorant, eau de toilette, hand sanitizer. We recommend your children consult their buddies for a complete list of items.

Spirit Week - Sometimes, it's important to just have fun! One opportunity to do so is during Spirit Week when each class dresses up according to a chosen theme. Wear your flair to your dance class that week. Concentrated Studies students wear theirs on the Saturday of that week only. Check our website calendar for Spirit Week dates.



Our Student Groups

Students form strong bonds, and one of the ways we encourage this is through our groups within the Concentrated Studies (CS) Program: BCB Company, BCB Junior Company and the Buddy System.

The BCB Company - The BCB Company is a select group of BCB students who are enrolled in the Concentrated Studies Program at level C2 or above. Entering the company is determined by audition, and standards must be maintained in order to remain a company dancer. One of the main purposes of the BCB Company is to help young dancers grow up! In the BCB Company, they learn responsibility, accountability, discipline and patience, all in a setting of friendship and respect. Company members are offered a chance to see the administrative side of dance by coordinating special fundraisers, organizing the Dance Slam and supervising other activities. Although there is a fee to join BCB Company,its members are exempt from audition and production fees.

The BCB Junior Company - The BCB Junior company is a newly created group made up of students who are enrolled in the Concentrated Studies Program at levels A2 (second half of the year only) through C1. There is no audition to join, but consistent class attendance and the student code of conduct must be followed in order to remain. There is no fee to join the Junior Company. In the second half of the year, certain C1 students may be invited, depending on their class attendance, conduct and maturity, to participate as Trainees in the BCB Company. This will help give them a sense of what to expect in the years to come.

Buddy System - In our Buddy System, each Concentrated Studies student is paired up with a BCB Company member who becomes a guide for your child: answering questions, offering advice and giving encouragement. Depending on the number of Company members, there are, on average, between 4-5 students in each buddy group. If there is anything your child is concerned or curious about, remind her/him to go to the buddies!

Codes of Conduct

Parents' Code of Conduct



- Please bring your dancer to all classes and rehearsals on time and in dress code.
- Help your dancer to be successful in BCB's program by making sure they understand the expectations outlined in our Policies as listed in our booklet. We ask that you and your child sign acknowledgement of having read this handbook together.
- Please observe good manners and sportsmanship by teaching your dancer to approach dance with a spirit of cooperation and support for his/her classmates.
- Everyone has strengths and weaknesses. Your dancer will progress in his/her own way and time. Please be patient and enjoy watching your child's journey. BCB teachers enjoy seeing your child advance and have only his/her progress in mind.
- If you have any questions, concerns, or if your dancer is having difficulties, please schedule a time to confer with the directors and teacher. The end of class is not an appropriate time to speak at length, and we would rather give full attention to the matter at hand.
- Please register on time. BCB plans ahead and needs to know its enrollment in advance.
- Please accept casting and level placement graciously. BCB's faculty have decades of experience and know your dancer well. If you have questions about placement or casting, please ask only about your own dancer and requirements there are for his/her class or role. Refrain from comparing your dancer to another. It is unethical for BCB teachers and directors to discuss other dancers with you.

Codes of Conduct Students' Code of Conduct

- Observe good sportsmanship! Accept class level placement with grace and dignity. Do not speak ill of others. Work with the other students in your class in a spirit of cooperation.
- Progress in ballet is very individual. Please do not judge others or compare yourself to others. Everyone has strengths and weaknesses. There will be times in your ballet career when you are a leader in your class and times when you will be challenged at your level. This is a normal part of the process and important lessons can be learned from both experiences.
- Regular attendance at class is imperative to your progress and shows respect to your teachers, your fellow students, and to yourself! Please do the best you can to attend all classes and rehearsals. On the other hand, when stress from homework is proving unsustainable, please stay home and take the time to focus on it. Just make sure you let us know and make up the class later.
- Our teachers want the best of you. They will be honest with you and often make necessary corrections. Look at their corrections and feedback as a sign of investment in you. Respect their opinions and their many years of experience in education. If you have questions or concerns, please schedule a conference.
- Read and abide by our social media policy in this booklet.
- Your mind and body need to grow and be strong: educate yourself about art, culture, and events in the world; educate yourself about nutrition; learn how to prevent injuries; take care of your body and mind before and after class.
- Accept who you are and be proud of your accomplishments!

Dress Code

Appearance in the classroom is preparation for appearance on the stage. It is a part of the discipline of dance, therefore each student is expected to dress neatly and to secure their hair properly for classes and rehearsals. Students will be asked to sit out the class if the dress code standards are not maintained. Jewelry, watches, bracelets, long or hoop earrings, and body piercings are not permitted in class.

Hair

Girls: Long hair must be placed in a bun with a hairnet, with bangs pinned away from the forehead, and slicked smooth with hair spray or gel. Short hair must be secured away from the face with headbands and clips. For chin length hair, girls may place their hair in two low ponytails just behind the ears. At the discretion of the teacher, ponytails, with no bangs and neatly smoothed, are permitted, in Modern, Contemporary, Jazz, & Hip-Hop. Boys: Long hair must be secured in a ponvtail.

Boys & Girls: Prior to a performance, please consult with the directors before getting a short haircut.

Girls: Leotard of any color; bare legs with ballet socks, Sept 1-Oct 31 & Apr 1-June 11; optional pink tights Nov 1-Mar 31; barefoot or pink Revolution ballet slippers with no strings.

Boys: Solid white T-shirt with no writing; sweatpants or biker shorts; barefoot or black ballet slippers.

Dance Basics, Ballet 1, Ballet 2 & Ballet 3*

Girls: Solid color light pink leotard; ballet socks, Sept 1 - Oct 31 & Apr 1 - June; optional pink tights, Nov 1 - Mar 31; Revolution pink ballet slippers with no strings; BCB character skirts.

Boys: Solid white T-shirt; black sweatpants or biker shorts: barefoot or black slippers: up to age 11 - full-seat dance brief; age 11 & up - dance belt. Please refer to



Jazz, Hip-Hop, Contemporary, Modern Girls: Black leotard; black footless, convertible tights or sweater tights; barefoot for Modern and Contemporary; barefoot or jazz shoes for Jazz & Hip-Hop.

Boys: White short-sleeved leotard, athletic Under Armour, or athletic t white T-shirt with no writing for Modern & Contemporary; solid color T-shirt with no writing for Jazz, Hip-Hop; black biker shorts, convertible black tights or jazz pants; full-seat dance brief. Please refer to www.dancebelt.info.

Recreational Students Ages 11+

Girls: Black leotard; pink or flesh toned convertible tights; barefoot for Modern and Contemporary; pink leather ballet slippers for Ballet.

Boys: White short-sleeved leotard or white athletic Under Armour t-shirt; black convertible tights worn inside black ballet slippers; dance belt. Please refer to <u>www.dancebelt.info</u>.

Required: Wear Moi Faustine Leotard in French Blue

Optional: Wear Moi Daphne Skirt in French Blue for pointe *E-level*

White short-sleeved leotard or white athletic Under Armour t-shirt; black convertible tights worn inside black ballet slippers; up to age 11 - full-seat dance brief; age 11 & up - dance belt. Please refer to www.dancebelt.info.

Girls: Hair accessories to match leotard color; on Saturday only, Concentrated Studies students may wear any solid color leotard; black or solid color skirts may be worn in all pre-pointe, pointe, variations, and partnering classes; on cold days, dancers may wear tight fitting, black or matching (to leotard color) sweaters and knitted leg warmers to match their tights color.

Boys: On Saturday only, Concentrated Studies students may wear any solid color leotard or solid color athletic t-shirt with no writing.
